New Dog Laws: Keep Your Paws in Check!

Attention, Kawana Island dog owners! As of July 31, 2024, new state-wide laws are in effect to ensure all pups are properly controlled in public places.

In public areas (excluding designated off-leash zones), dogs must be on a leash, tethered to a fixed object under supervision, or kept in a temporary enclosure while supervised.

Even in off-leash areas, your furry friends need to be supervised and responsive to voice commands.

Failure to comply could cost you..... a hefty on-the-spot fine of \$806!

While some local rules haven't changed—like dog-prohibited zones and the duty to clean up after vo.

zones and the duty to clean up after your pet—it's crucial to be aware of these new regulations. Remember, this is a state government mandate, not a Council decision, the council and the community need to adhere to these new laws.

For more details, check out the Sunshine Coast Council's website. And don't worry, there are still two fantastic dog parks nearby—one on the north of the island and another just off the south on Nicklin Way.

Watch Out for Blue Tongue Skinks: Our Local Sun Seekers!

With the sunny weather here, our local blue tongue skinks are out and about, basking in the sunshine. Unfortunately, several have been found dead on the roads recently, so let's all stay vigilant to protect these unique reptiles!

Blue tongue skinks are known for their bright blue tongues, which they use to scare off predators. They're territorial creatures and can live up to 20 years, often sticking around the same area. Plus, they're great at controlling garden pests like insects and snails.

If you're driving, please slow down and watch for skinks, especially on sunny days when they're most active. A little caution goes a long way in keeping our local wildlife safe. Let's give these sun-loving skinks a chance to thrive on our beautiful island!

Watch out for swooping magpies, especially around common breeding spots like local parks, playgrounds, and along the pathways near Double Bay Park and Parrearra Canal.

Stay safe by wearing hats, sunglasses, and keeping an eye out. Avoid known nesting areas if possible, and let's all make it through magpie season unscathed!

Stay Crime-Safe on Kawana Island!

With the warmer weather here, it's a great time to enjoy the outdoors on Kawana Island, but it's also important to stay vigilant about safety.

Recent statistics show that the Sunshine Coast is facing its highest crime rates in over 20 years, with 28,664 recorded offences in 2023—a 35% increase since 2013

To help keep our community safe:

- Secure all doors, windows, and garages, especially at night or when you're away.
- Hide car keys and valuables out of sight.
- Install security cameras for added protection.
- Keep an eye on your neighbor's homes if they're away on holiday.

Crimes like unlawful vehicle use have more than doubled, highlighting the need for vigilance.

Even though the overall offence rate decreased slightly last year, offences against persons rose by 4.8%.

By taking these simple precautions and looking out for each other, we can help keep Kawana Island safe this summer.

Is It Time to Ditch the **'Bin Chicken' Name?**

Is it time to rethink the ibis's reputation? Often dubbed the "bin chicken" for its dumpster-diving habits, this resilient bird might deserve a more flattering name. Researchers at the University of the Sunshine Coast think so, and they're inviting you to help rename the ibis with suggestions like "Survival Swan" or "Furiosa Phoenix."

The university is tracking up to 500 ibises tagged with pink and blue markers to study their movements and behavior. You can join in by scanning a QR code to help track these birds and even suggest new names.



Fun Facts About the Ibis

Despite their reputation, ibises are symbols of adaptability, thriving in urban areas by eating scraps and insects.

Historically, they were revered in ancient Egypt as symbols of wisdom.
